

## Sample Event Budgets

Typical formats for events include workshops, lectures, panel discussions, exhibitions, and performances; however, there are no specific limitations in terms of formats set by the Collegium Helveticum.

The list provided below gives you rough numbers to calculate costs for elements of an event. For an international conference (duration 1.5 to 2 days), the Collegium usually has a maximum of 1 to 2 guests from overseas (economy flight and accommodation for up to 3 nights) and a maximum 2 to 3 guests from Europe (economy flight/train 2nd class and accommodation for 1-2 nights). Before inviting international guests, we encourage you to consider inviting local experts as well, to avoid unnecessary carbon emissions. The Collegium covers costs for travel expenses of invited participants. The Collegium usually does not to pay a honorarium for invited speakers, except for independent artists, scholars, writers etc. Below you can find sample budgets for a conference and a workshop to give you a realistic sense of costs to expect.
